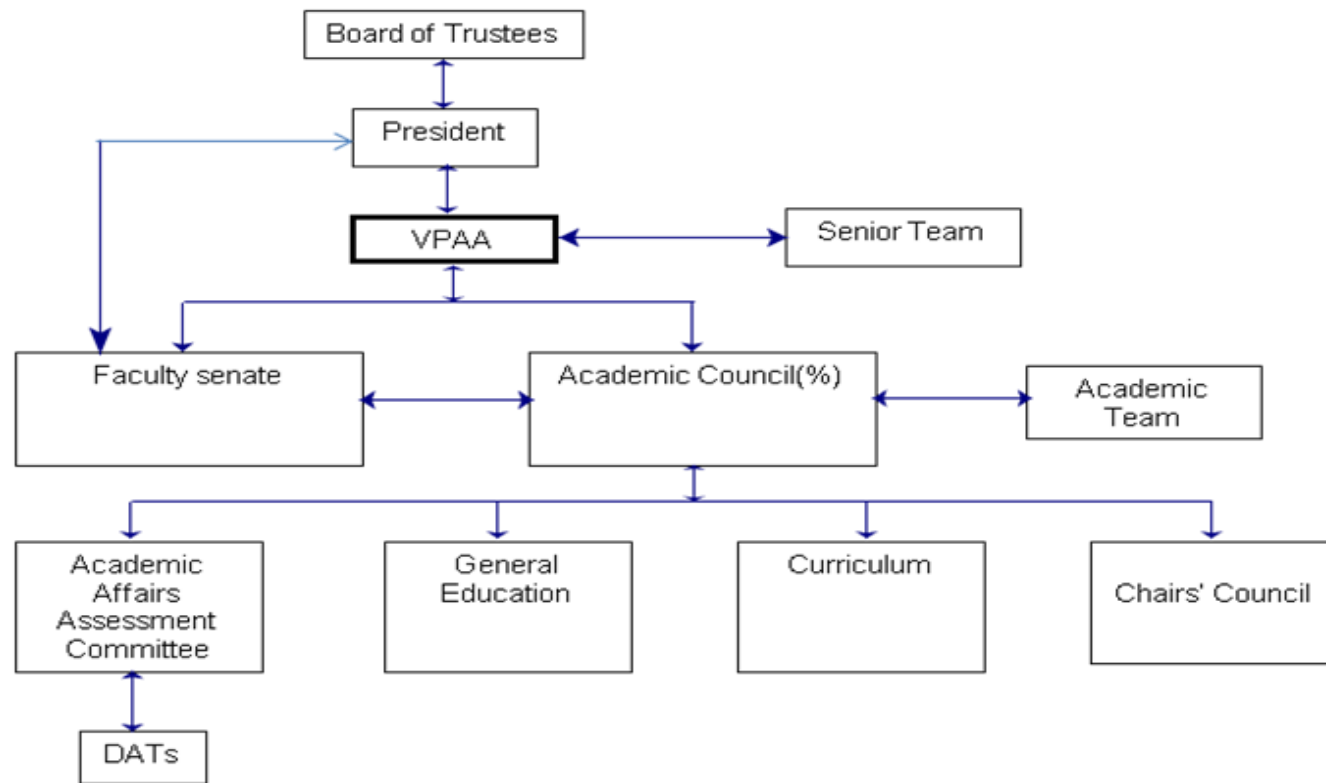


## Decision-Making Process of Academic Affairs



When reviewing this chart, please remember that it is meant to outline the decision-making committees in Academic Affairs.

\*The Academic Council will be composed of seventeen voting members as follows. A minimum of 2/3 of the voting members of the Council must be members of the faculty.

The president of the Faculty Organization, and two additional members of the Faculty Organization (one full-time and one adjunct) appointed by the Faculty Senate; two department chairs, appointed by the Chairs' Council; two academic deans, appointed by the Academic Deans; one student appointed by the Student Governance Board; one co-chair of the Curriculum Committee, appointed by the Curriculum Committee\*; the chair of the Academic Outcomes Assessment Committee\*; the chair of the General Education Task Force\*; The chair of the Faculty Professional Development Committee\*; The chair of the Distance Learning Advisory Committee; the Dean of Learning Technologies and Support Services; one faculty representative from Workforce Development and Continuing Education, appointed by the VP for WDCE; one faculty representative from Student Services, appointed by the VP for Student Services

VPAA and the Faculty Organization President are the ex-officio co-chairs.

It is expected that the chair of this committee will be a member of the faculty. If that is not the case, then the chair will not serve as a voting member of the Academic Council. Rather, the committee will elect one of its faculty members to serve as a voting member of the Academic Council. The chair of the committee is still encouraged to attend meetings of the Council." *Faculty Organization Bylaws*.
