





## Creating Virtual Machine with VMWare

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Start VMWare</li> <li>2. File   New   Virtual Machine</li> <li>3. Next   select <b>Typical</b>   Next</li> <li>4. Select the guest operating system</li> <li>5. Scroll and selection the version   Next</li> </ol>	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>6. Name your virtual machine</li> <li>7. Select the location to store VM files</li> <li>8. Next</li> </ol>	
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>9. Select the network type: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bridged for external access such as the Internet.</li> <li>• Host-only for containment, no external network access</li> </ul> </li> <li>10. Next</li> <li>11. Disk size: _____</li> <li>12. Check Allocate all disk space now</li> <li>13. Finish – VMWare will create your drive</li> </ol>	
<p><b>Self-check:</b> If you didn't do step 12. Right-click the virtual machine that you just created under "Favorites" and Click "Delete from disk", then start at the beginning.</p>	

## Installing the Guest Operating System

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Insert the installation CD</li> <li>2. Power-up the virtual machine using <b>one</b> of the following method: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Click "Start this virtual machine"</li> <li>• Click the green power-on button</li> </ul> </li> <li>3. Install the guest operating system.....</li> </ol>

## Using Virtual Machine

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Click in the area of the virtual machine monitor. This gives the virtual machine control of the mouse.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Press Alt-Ctrl to take control of the mouse from the virtual machine.</li> </ol>
